BRICKS Equivalency Guide

Ohio University BRICKS General Education Requirements

BRICKS is Ohio University's general education program, and requirements must be fulfilled by all baccalaureate degree students. BRICKS includes a minimum of 38 credit hours across five categories: Foundations, Pillars, Arches, Bridges, and Capstone.

BRICKS and the Ohio Transfer 36

Students who complete the minimum requirements of the Ohio Transfer 36 (OT36, formerly the Ohio Transfer Module), at another college or university prior to enrollment in a degree-seeking program at Ohio University will receive transfer credit equivalent to fulfilling Ohio University's BRICKS general education requirements in Foundations (excluding the Advanced Writing component, which requires completion of TME 002 Second Writing), Pillars, and Arches. If you have not completed the OT36 your courses will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis and will apply toward general education requirements as appropriate.

Individual courses completed that meet state guaranteed equivalencies for the OT36, yet have no course equivalency at Ohio University will transfer to meet select requirements for Ohio University's BRICKS as follows:

Foundations

Foundations include four components and emphasize written communication, quantitative reasoning, and intercultural knowledge and competence. **Students are required to complete a total of 11 semester hours from an approved list of courses in the four component areas.**

Students who have completed the OT36 will be awarded completion of Foundations requirements (excluding the Advanced Writing component, which requires completion of TME 002 Second Writing).

Written Communication

Pillars

Pillars include four components and emphasize knowledge and methods associated with the arts, humanities, natural sciences, and social sciences through distributed courses. **Students are required to complete a total of 12 semester hours from an approved list of courses in the four component areas.**

Students who have completed the OT36 will be awarded completion of the Pillars Requirement.

Take at least 1 course from this list (minimum of 3 semester hours)

HIST courses marked with an asterisk (*) will automatically equate to fill Pillars Humanities Texts and Contexts, but may alternately equate to fill Pillars Social and Behavioral Sciences. Work with your academic advisor to make adjustments if needed.
